Coming This Week:

- **Cross Country:** The Quakers compete in the Indiana Intercollegiate Championships on Friday in Terre Haute, Indiana. The meet is at 4 p.m.
- **Field Hockey:** Earlham (2-2, 0-2) have a pair of matches this week on Comstock Field. Friday, the Quakers face North Coast Athletic Conference foe Denison at 4:30 p.m. Transylvania provides the opposition on Saturday at 1 p.m.
- **Football:** The Quakers (1-1) visit Anderson on Saturday for their first road game of the season and only night contest. The non-conference contest begins at 7 p.m.
- **Men's Soccer:** Earlham (4-1-1) enters Friday's contest at Thomas More with a three-match winning streak. The non-conference affair gets underway at 5 p.m.
- **Men's Tennis:** The Quakers (1-0) go to Manchester on Thursday. The match is set to start at 4 p.m.
- **Volleyball:** After winning a pair of matches last week, Earlham (2-7) entertains Defiance Wednesday at 7 p.m. The Quakers travel to Anderson to play the Ravens on Saturday and then the squad will face Franklin the same day.
- **Women's Soccer:** The Quakers (5-1) travel to Albion College on Friday. The non-conference contest begins at 5 p.m.

And From Last Week:

- **Field Hockey:** The Quakers lost last Saturday in a NCAC match to Wooster 7-2. Kate Birdsall and Cassie Gage scored the goals for the Quakers.
- **Football:** Earlham won its first contest of the season with a 31-21 victory over Manchester last Saturday. Quarterback Dorian Jenkins was named the NCAC Offensive Player of the Week after leading two touchdown drives in the final period to give the Quakers the win. Defensively, Adam LaFollette led the Quakers with 12 tackles. LaFollette also had three quarterback sacks.
- **Men's Soccer:** The Quakers have won three matches in the last week by beating Grace 2-1, Hanover 1-0 in double overtime and Anderson 4-1 on Tuesday. Nick Costello highlighted the double overtime win over Hanover with the lone goal, while Bannet Asingura scored twice in the win over Anderson.
- **Men's Tennis:** The Quakers opened the season on Tuesday with an 8-1 win over Wilmington.
- **Volleyball:** Ramona Hemmings was named to the Garnet Classic All-Tournament Team after the Quakers split four contests in the event. Earlham posted wins over Wheaton (MA) and Albright (PA).
- **Women's Soccer:** The Quakers went 2-1 over the last week with a 5-0 loss at Thomas More and wins over St. Mary-of-the-Woods (7-0) and Anderson (5-0). Lauren Berry led the Quakers with a goal and three assists at St. Mary-of-the-Woods. Against Anderson the Quakers had 50 shots and five different players scored goals in the win. Berry, Karman Duchon, JoBeth Buckley, Kelly Sprague and Rachel Dana all found the back of the net in the contest.
- **Women's Tennis:** Earlham split two contests last Saturday. The Quakers lost 8-1 to Rose-Hulman before beating Defiance 9-0.
