



EARLHAM COLLEGE ATHLETICS UPDATE



Coming This Week:

- **Cross Country:** The Quakers do not have a meet this week. The next event is the Indiana Intercollegiate Championships in Terre Haute, Indiana. The meet is Friday, Sep. 18.
- **Field Hockey:** Earlham (2-1) has a two-match winning streak as the Quakers prepare to face the College of Wooster on Saturday. The North Coast Athletic Conference contest gets underway on Comstock Field at 1 p.m.
- **Football:** The Quakers (0-1) play Manchester College in Darrell Beane Stadium on Saturday. The Spartans come to Richmond with a 0-1 mark after falling last week to Trine University 16-14. The non-conference contest begins at 1 p.m.
- **Men's Soccer:** Earlham (1-1-1) has a pair of home matches this week. The Quakers welcome Grace College today at 5 p.m. On Saturday, Earlham entertains Hanover College at 2 p.m.
- **Volleyball:** Earlham (0-5) makes its longest trip of the season this weekend as the Quakers travel to Philadelphia for a tournament at Swarthmore College. The Quakers play Albright College (PA) and Wheaton (MA) on Saturday. Sunday's opponents will be determined by Saturday's results.
- **Women's Soccer:** The Quakers (3-0) play on the road twice this week. Earlham visits Thomas More College on Friday at 6 p.m. On Saturday, the Quakers travel to St. Mary-of-the-Woods College for at match at 3 p.m.
- **Women's Tennis:** The fall season begins for the Quakers as they play Rose-Hulman and Defiance College in Defiance, Ohio.

And From Last Week:

- **Cross Country:** The Earlham men's team finished second of nine teams at the Franklin Invitational last Saturday, while the women were seventh. Jacob Naegeli was the top finisher for the men taking fourth in 26:59.79. Hannah Santino was the top runner for the women with a 22:17.17 to finish 28th.
- **Field Hockey:** The Quakers won two matches last weekend. Kate Birdsall led the Quakers with two goals and an assist in a 3-1 win over St. Vincent on Saturday. The Quakers followed that with a 2-0 win over Wells on Sunday.
- **Football:** Earlham opened its season with a 61-24 loss last Saturday. Quarterback Dorian Jenkins finished the contest with 13 completions in 24 attempts for 174 yards and two touchdowns. Chris Owens topped the receivers with six grabs for 79 yards and a score. Defensively, Ben Randall led the Quakers with 12 tackles, while Adam Lafollette added nine to the effort.
- **Men's Soccer:** Earlham had two double overtime matches last weekend. The Quakers beat Adrian 2-1 on Friday when Nick Costello scored the game-winning goal, which was followed by a wild victory celebration. Against Lawrence on Saturday, Costello had the only goal in a match that ended in a 1-1 tie.
- **Volleyball:** Keeley McAnnis-Entenman made the all-tournament team in the EC Quaker Classic. Unfortunately for Earlham, the Quakers dropped two contests to Principia and matches to Rose-Hulman and the University of the Cumberland.
- **Women's Soccer:** Karman Duchon became Earlham's all-time leading scorer on Saturday as the Quakers beat Lawrence 6-2 for their third straight win. With 86 points in her career, Duchon passed current assistant coach Hillary Carter, who finished with 85 points in her career. Earlham also defeated Adrian College 3-0 last Friday. Joy Doucette currently leads the Quakers in scoring with seven points. She has three goals and one assist.
